### Primary School PE and Sports Funding 2018-2019



The Primary School PE and Sports Funding was introduced to enhance physical activity and competitive sport for all primary school pupils. At Langshott Primary School we believe that physical activity and sport are essential to the health and well-being of the school community. We value the benefit it brings to our physical and mental health as well as the impact it can have on pupil progress, fitness and self-esteem.

For the academic year 2018 - 2019 we have been given £18920 to spend on developing this area. Following consultation with staff and pupils and from the training and advice from the Local Authority we will be spending our funding on the following:
