

Who are we and what do we do?

Breck Foundation is a self-funded charity set up by Lorin LaFave, in memory of her son Breck who lost his life to an online groomer through a gaming relationship. Since then, Lorin has made numerous TV and radio appearances to raise awareness of online grooming and promote digital resilience. She also speaks regularly at police and school training sessions, as well as safeguarding, policy change and Ofsted conferences.

We use Breck's story to educate young people, teachers, support staff and parents about the risks of online grooming to empower young people to make better choices when interacting online, leading to safer outcomes.

What will your child learn?

Early intervention is key to our work. We present to children of all ages in an age-appropriate and engaging way using Breck's real-life story, teaching an ethos of Play Virtual / Live Real and emphasising that online friendships are not the same as real-life relationships. We remind everyone to never meet up alone or in a private place if meeting an online friend.

FAQs

What should I do if I have concerns about the content of the presentation?

We make sure that the content of our talks is age appropriate, but if you have any concerns please contact the school staff member organising this event.

What should I do after the presentation?

Speak to your child about what they thought of the presentation.

Ask if they have any concerns about the subject.

Reassure your child they can talk to you about any concerns relating to online behaviour.

Remind them to look out for their friends too.
