A Note from the Governors

I regard being Chair of Governors of such a great school as Langshott to be a massive honour and I have thoroughly enjoyed working with the dedicated and talented staff, the committed governors who so generously give their time, but, most of all, the enthusiastic and joyful children.

I could easily write pages extolling the virtues of dozens of members of staff, as I can recall so many occasions when I have seen them go "above and beyond" for the children at the school. However, as Chair, I have had the privilege to work closely with the Headteacher, Mrs Mackintosh, and I am in awe of her commitment, skill and focus on what is best for the pupils; characteristics she retains even in the most difficult of circumstances. I have no doubt that her devotion to high standards has established and maintains a culture, which is the prime reason the school delivers such excellent education and care for the children. I was therefore delighted to see that the Ofsted Inspector, who visited us recently, has written so positively about the school and, in particular, noted "the high expectations which permeate throughout all aspects of the school's work".

When I was first elected to the role of Chair in 2018, I made it clear that I would not hold the post for more than five years. There are many reasons why I think such a limit is a good idea, but amongst them is my view that governing boards often become stale if the Chair overstays their welcome. My fellow governors will therefore elect a new Chair for September and, although I will stay on as a governor for short while to enable a smooth handover, I will resign from the board after that. I will be immensely sad to leave Langshott but, like the children in Year 6, I will move on knowing the time is right and treasuring many memories of my time at Langshott.

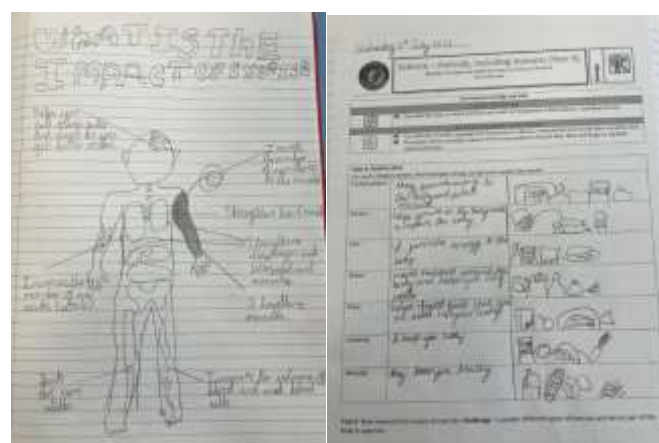
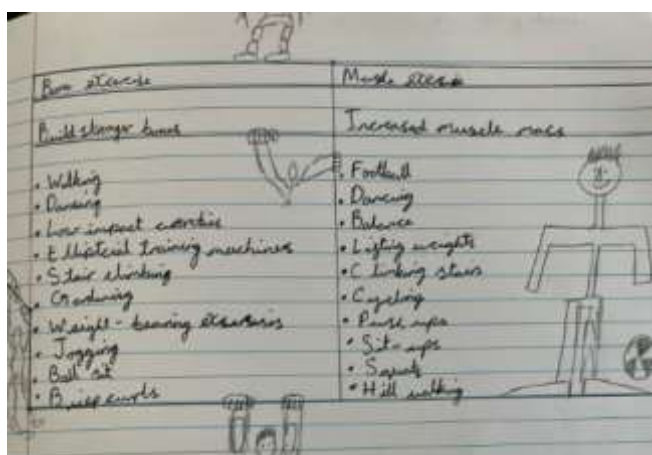
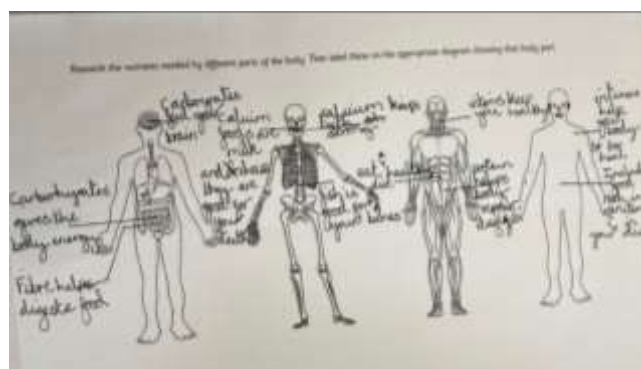
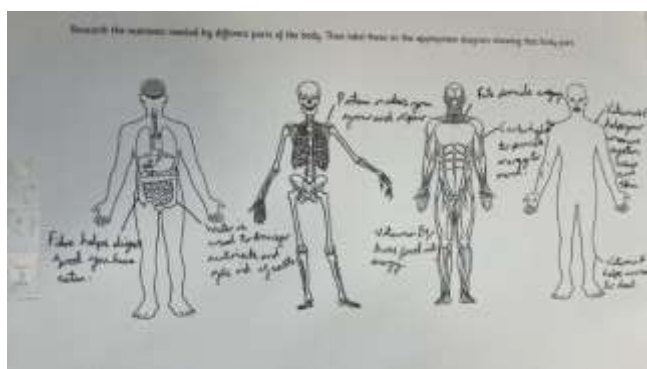
Science

Forest School News

In our final half term of the year, Reception enjoyed their second block of Forest School learning. We searched for mini-beasts, learnt about the life cycles of birds and butterflies and harvested our vegetables. It was incredible to see how much they have progressed with their independence and resilience since their Forest School learning in the Autumn term. It was also lovely to enjoy a much warmer and drier season at Forest School with them!





Years 1 to 5 also benefited from extra Forest School sessions this half term as part of the transition process. We played games and took part in activities, which helped us to prepare for the coming year, focusing on independence and resilience.

We have also been incredibly lucky to spot some exciting wildlife in our sessions this half term. As well as being inundated with hundreds of froglets, Year 3 came very close to a young deer during one of their sessions and Reception spotted a tiny little mouse scurrying around nearby. We even managed to take a photo!

In September, Year 1, Year 2 and Year 6 (the current Reception, current Year 1 and current Year 5) will begin the school year with their Forest School sessions throughout the first half of the Autumn term. Please look out for the relevant letter to ensure that your child has their kit in school on the correct day.



PE

Reception - We have had lots of fun on the field this half term and the children in Reception loved the freedom of having such a great space to stretch their legs. As well as lots of different 'tag' type games, they have been practising their relay skills using a treasure chest (hoop) and treasure (beanbags). Watch out for this event on sports day! They really support each other so well!

Year 1 - Our young athletes in Year 1 have shown such resilience during our PE sessions. They are always trying their hardest, especially when they had to run 200 metres! They have also loved the foam javelin and the vortex howlers!

Year 2 - Year 2 have been getting to grips with relay during our PE sessions this half term. They have loved being part of a team and they really support each other so well. We also worked on our long jumps and throwing techniques with the vortex howlers, which is a favourite with everyone!

Year 3 - Year 3s were so resilient when they had to run a bit further during some of the sessions we had this half term. They did not give up at all. Over the last few weeks, we have also worked on the triple jump - breaking it down to a hop, leap and a jump - and some hurdle practise.

Year 4 - During our sessions, the Year 4s have loved the triple jump and long jump and are very keen on the vortex howlers. Now the field is dry, we mapped out a 200m track and they had an option of running 200m (1 lap) or 400m (2 laps). They could either compete with the rest of the class or run for pleasure. Some wanted to do both!

Year 5 - Like the Year 4s, Year 5s could choose to do either a 200m, 400m or 800m (4 laps). I am so impressed at how resilient this year group is and how much energy they have. They could also choose to race or run for pleasure and it was lovely seeing the children smile as they ran with friends and the amazing support they gave each other. We have also worked on relay, long jump and hurdles.

Year 6 - Sporty Year 6s were also given the options above, to run either 200m, 400m or 800m (4 laps) with many asking if they could have more than one go! They have really built up such great resilience and really throw themselves into any challenge. As well as running, we have been working on relay changeovers, hurdles, long jump and vortex howlers.

Parents of children in Key Stage 2

T = take responsibility for your actions,

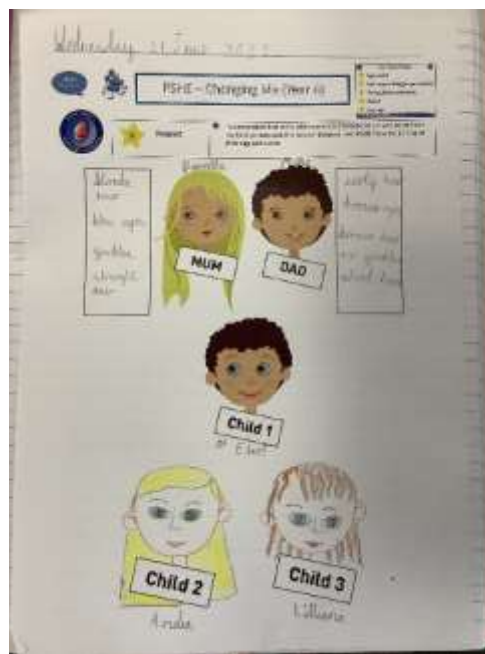
R = respect and

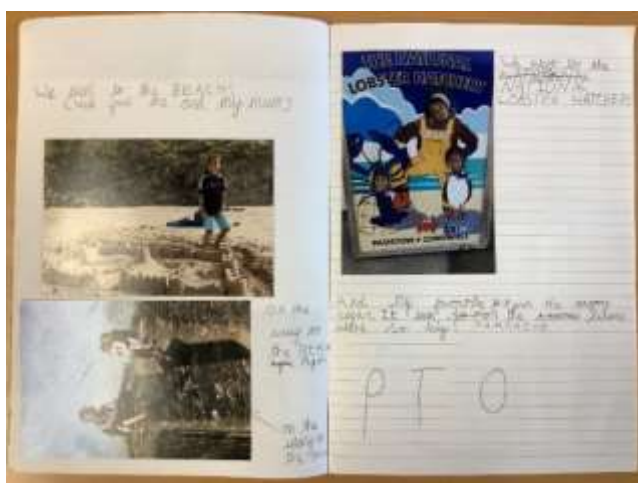
