### Reading

Please hear your child read the Rhino Reader book on a daily basis and record each read in the reading record. We collect reading diaries in on a **Monday** and award STARS Points for regular reading. Rhino Reader books are changed every **Thursday.** Please make sure your child has their book wallet in their book bag **every day**!

#### **Book Bag and Water Bottle**

Please ensure your child has their book bag and a water bottle every day.

#### **Outdoor Clothing**

As the weather is unpredictable, please ensure your child has a coat with them each day.

#### Waterproofs

Please return your child's waterproofs in a carrier/ drawstring bag. These will be left on their peg and used when necessary this term.

**Spring 1** - The learning will focus around the theme 'our world'. We will read a range of texts, including The Smartest Giant in Town, The Firefly's Light: The Secret Inventors of Our Natural World, Tree: Seasons Come, Seasons Go and The Oak Tree. The children will use these texts to support their writing, creativity and imagination.



**Spring 2** - Our theme this half term is 'make believe'. Some of the texts that we will read are Superworm, Superduck and Supertato. Towards the end of this half term, we will plant seeds and read the story of Jack and the Jelly Bean Stalk. The children will use their experience of planting seeds to write instructions.

## Can you help us?


Local Walk - We will be taking the children on a walk around Horley to support their understanding of the world and where they live.
