- in finding their unique place in the Langshott and wider community

Langshott School will:

- Promote the school values of **Learning, Pride and Success** and encourage your child to uphold them
- Provide a happy, caring and secure environment in which to learn
- Provide a high standard of education, informed by rigorous national guidelines, within a balanced curriculum.
- Ensure good standards of behaviour and discipline.
- Ensure our learning environment is stimulating and challenging.
- Celebrate your child's academic and personal achievements.
- Provide the scaffolding needed to enable your child to achieve their full potential.
- Care for your child's safety and well-being by observation and listening to them.
- Deal with problems calmly and fairly, having listened to your child's point of view and inform you about any problems or difficulties of a more serious nature.
- Teach your child to develop a positive attitude to one another, regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, values, age and need.

- Encourage your child to become an active member within our community and help them to see that they can have an impact on the world around them.
- Provide opportunities for us to communicate with you on the progress of your child, celebrating their strengths and explaining how we can support and scaffold them in their areas for development and take account of your views about your child's needs.
- Provide information to you about our school, including relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and open days.
- Be happy to welcome you if you would like to contribute to our school's broader curriculum. We recognise that the community of Langshott holds a wealth of talent, experience, diversity and enthusiasm that our school could benefit richly from.

As a Langshott Parent/Carer I will:

- Make sure that my child arrives at school on time and attends every day except if they are ill. I will not take them out of school in term time for holidays or treat days. I will provide a note of explanation if my child is absent and call the School Office on the initial day of absence and everyday thereafter.
- Ensure that they are prepared for school by having adequate sleep the night before and properly equipped with their book bag, reading record, homework, named PE kit etc...
- Make sure that my child is wearing named school uniform and sensible black shoes.
- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting my child's learning, behaviour or ability to do work.
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards all members of our community.
- Support the school by making sure that homework tasks are completed and returned on time.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning.
- Support and work with the school to ensure that the behaviour management policies of the school are maintained, particularly with my child.
- Read all information sent home as this gives me important details of relevant policies, meetings, workshops, activities, newsletters and other events.
- Provide the school with up to date emergency contact telephone numbers
- Inform the school in writing when my child needs to take prescribed medication in school
- Support the school and The Friends PTA when fundraising and organising activities for the benefit of a variety of causes and also our school.
- Use my talents and experiences to enhance my child's learning at home – Your child will benefit greatly from what you can show them, discuss with them and teach them.

As a pupil of Langshott Primary School, I will:

- Understand that I have rights within the school some of which are:
 - ✓ To be treated kindly
 - ✓ To be listened to
 - ✓ To be helped
 - ✓ To feel wanted
 - ✓ To be safe
- Respect other children's culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values.
- Accept responsibility for the things that I do.
- Be responsible for my school and home work.

- Ask for help if I need it and try my best in all that I do.
- Follow the school's Golden Rules and classroom rules.
- Be kind and speak politely to everyone in school.
- Behave in a safe way at all times
- Behave well when wearing the Langshott uniform, understanding that I am representing the school community.
- Be helpful.
- Tell a member of staff if I am worried or unhappy.
- Take good care of the building, equipment and school grounds.
- Ensure that I take home all school letters.
