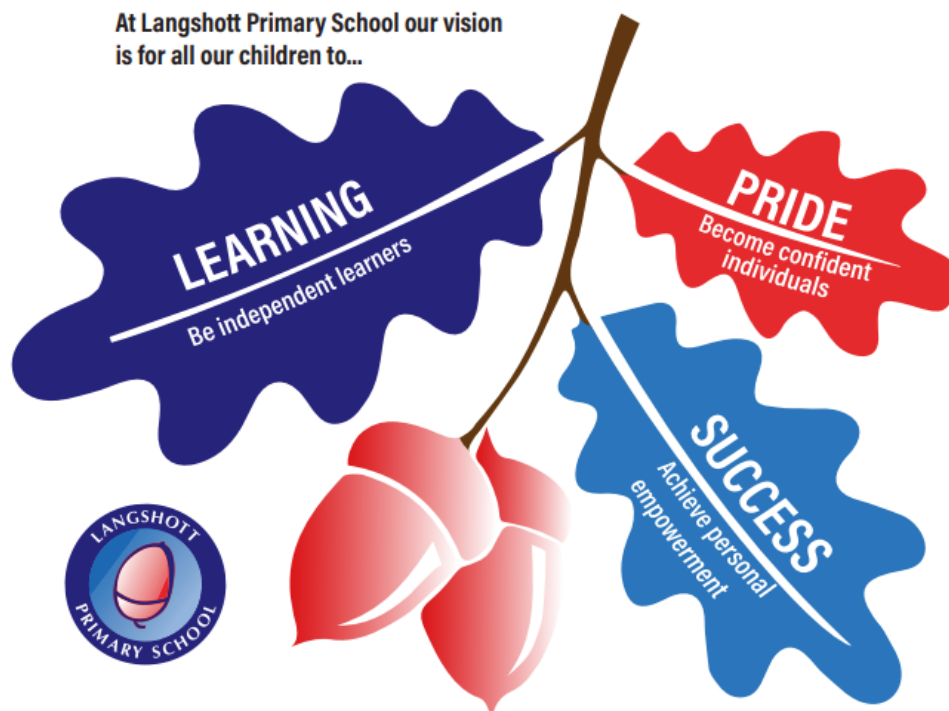

Our Curriculum Intent

Nurturing – helping and encouraging personal development and relationships.

Global Citizens – building an awareness and understanding of the world.

Subject Knowledge – acquiring facts, information and skills through experience.

High Standards – achieving a high level of quality and attainment.

Opportunities – creating occasions or situations that make it possible to experience memorable moments.

Transferable Skills – cultivating skills that can be applied in a range of contexts.

Tenacity – persisting with determination.

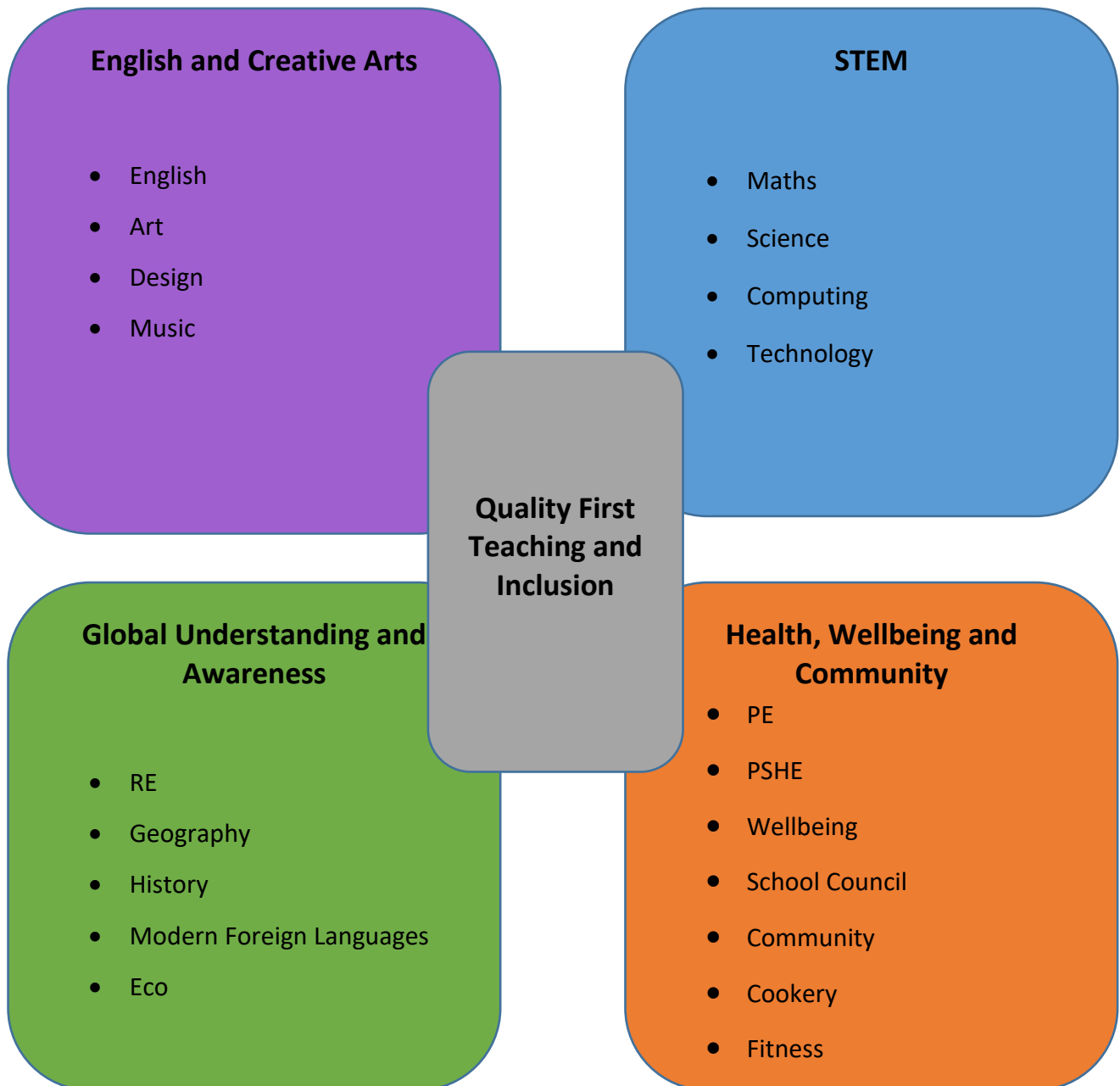
The 4Rs of Effective Learning

The 4Rs of Reciprocity, Reflectiveness, Resilience and Resourcefulness are key elements of effective learning and will be referred to in every lesson.



Langshott Learning Faculties

At Langshott Primary School, faculties provide the school with a clear vision for staff to plan and develop innovative lessons which build on prior learning. Progress from Reception to Year 6 is clear for children to be able to talk about their learning. The diagram below shows how the teams are set out.



Early Years Foundation Stage

Our Early Years setting follows the curriculum as outlined in the latest version of the EYFS statutory framework that applied from September 2021.

The EYFS framework includes 7 areas of learning and development that are equally important and inter-connected. However, 3 areas known as the prime areas are seen as particularly important for igniting curiosity and enthusiasm for learning and for building children’s capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive.

The prime areas are:

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development

The prime areas are strengthened and applied through 4 specific areas:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

All the areas are delivered through a combination of planned, purposeful activity and opportunities for free play, with a balance of adult-led and child-initiated activities. We aim to harness children’s natural curiosity and motivation and to capitalise on their strengths and interests in order to promote positive attitudes to learning. We encourage all children to be independent, confident and resilient and to develop effective communication skills. These attributes will provide a strong foundation for future learning.

From the Foundation Stage, your child will progress into Key Stage One (KS1) and then Key Stage Two (KS2). We believe that children learn best when the curriculum is broad and balanced and at Langshott, the learning experiences are meticulously planned to provide rigour, excellence and enjoyment in equal measure.

Key Stage One (KS1 – Years 1 and 2)

Children in Year 1 will continue with aspects of the EYFS curriculum up to the autumn half term. This is to ease their transition into this phase. After this period, they will increasingly be taught on a more formal basis and follow the Primary National Curriculum. Children in Year 2 follow the Primary National Curriculum.

Key Stage Two (KS2 – Years 3 to 6)

Children in Years 3 to 6 continue to follow the Primary National Curriculum, which in this phase includes the addition of a Modern Foreign Language. The School, after much consultation with parents and local secondary schools, has opted to teach Spanish.

The organisation of the curriculum gives us a systematic approach to the teaching of the key skills and provides the basis for English and Mathematics, as well as the application of Computing.



These subjects are taught discretely and also form a natural part of the learning that your child will undertake in other subjects. Science and the other foundation subjects are taught through carefully planned topics to create strong links, so that knowledge and skills can be used across the curriculum.

Core subjects:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science
- Computing
- Religious Education

Foundation subjects:

- Art
- Design and Technology
- Humanities (History and Geography)
- Music
- Personal, Social, Health and Moral Education
- Physical Education
- Modern Foreign Languages; Spanish

Our curriculum is just one step in the learning journey for your child. We recognise that learning begins at birth, if not before. We aim to promote an interest in learning that will carry on throughout your child’s life. We liaise very closely with families, pre-schools and other local schools to provide continuity of education from four to eleven years.

Off-site Trips and Visiting Professionals

Trips and visits out of school form an important part of our curriculum enabling the children to learn in different environments and to see things first hand. Trips that we regularly do include Brooklands, Drusillas Park, Juniper Hall, Painshill Park and Wakehurst Place. Our curriculum is also enhanced by visitors coming into school to talk about various topics. Typical visitors include sports personalities, motivational speakers and wildlife experts.



Extra-Curricular Clubs

Langshott Primary School offers a range of activities at lunchtime and after school to enable all pupils to access a broad and enriched experience outside the formal school day. The clubs on offer at various times in the year include: Art, Badminton, Board Games, Dance, Football and Music and Musical Theatre.

Rewards

Rewarding good work and behaviour is an important part of what we do. We reward with STARS Points and via an app called MarvellousMe. This is a light-touch app that our teachers use to share wonderful news with parents about your child's learning and skills development. The MarvellousMe Parent app is free, fun and simple to use. It will help you to:

- Have a meaningful conversation with your child about their school day.
- Continue your child's learning and practise topics that they have done in class.
- Celebrate and reinforce their successes and positive behaviours.

Expectations of Children

We expect our children to succeed at Langshott Primary School and run positive reward systems such as STARS Points, certificates and an electronic rewards app called MarvellousMe to support and encourage the children's achievement. The school has a list of rules for Behaviour, to the right...

Should children fall short of our expectations for good behaviour a sanction will be imposed, such as missing a playtime.



Expectations of Parents / Carers

We are fortunate to have very supportive parents who recognise that educating children is a partnership. We therefore welcome parents' involvement in all aspects of the school. We have a Code of Conduct for parents that acts as a reminder about what we expect from everyone to ensure a safe and positive school environment for our children. A summary is below.

We expect all our parents and visitors to show respect for others by:

- Allowing plenty of time in the mornings, so that children arrive punctually and are ready to start the school day.
- Sending children to school every day except when they are genuinely unwell.
- Supporting children to do their homework and reading with them regularly.
- Setting a good example in their own speech and behaviour towards all members of the school community, both on school premises and in the immediate area. This includes never using loud, aggressive, threatening or offensive language.
- Not displaying photographs of the children on social media sites or referring to the school in a negative way on social media.
- Parking carefully and avoiding parking, waiting or stopping in areas which must be kept clear (for example, outside the school gates).
- Not being under the influence of alcohol or drugs on the school premises.
- Raising issues with the school and not posting derogatory comments on social media.

Pupil Voice

At Langshott we feel it is important to involve the pupils in the school and to listen to their opinions. We elect school councillors in the Autumn Term to be on the School Council. Recently, children on the Council have helped to decide on markings for the new playground, set up a friendship buddy system for playtimes and represented Langshott at various community events.

Ofsted

Our last Ofsted inspection was 23rd May 2023. It was an Ungraded inspection where the inspector concluded that the school remained “Good”. This link will take you to the report on the Ofsted website: <https://files.ofsted.gov.uk/v1/file/50223554>

Before that, we were inspected on 13th and 14th September 2017 when we had a full inspection and were graded as “Outstanding” for Leadership and Management, “Outstanding” for Behaviour and Welfare and “Outstanding” for Early Years. We were “Good” for Outcomes and Teaching and Learning.

Special Needs vary in nature and, if your child is identified as having additional requirements, appropriate provision will be made within the constraints of our budget. 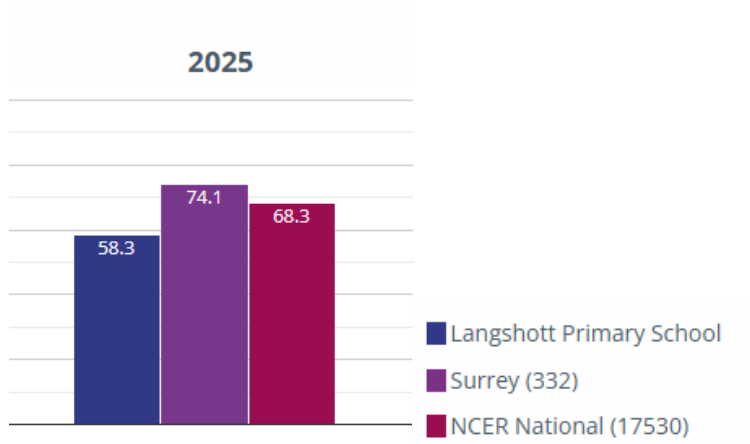
More Able Support

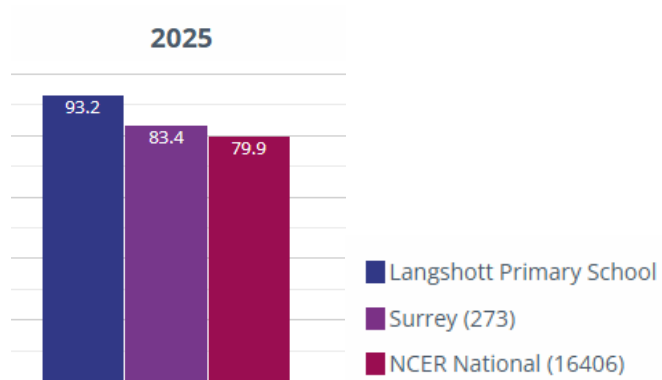

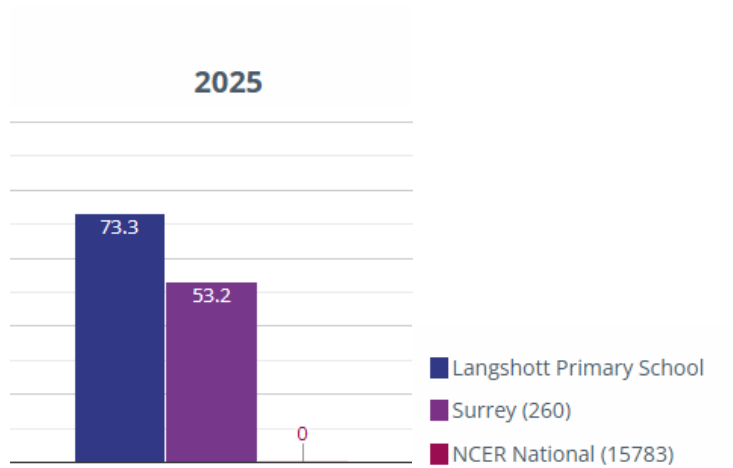
RECEPTION – GLD:

Communication

Using Images of Children: Photographs, Videos and Websites

Generally, photographs of children are used for school and occasionally for publication in the local Press. These are a source of pleasure and pride and are to be welcomed. However, we live in an age in which technology has vastly increased the use, and potential misuse, of photographs. Having taken advice from Surrey Police and Surrey County Council, we believe that the risk of a child being identified by a stranger is so small that, provided reasonable steps are in place to limit the publication of their names and addresses, photography of children at the school should continue, in line with the following guidelines. We will not use children's full names alongside their photographs in the school's own printed publications, in video films or on our website. However, pupil's first names may be used.

With regard to the Press, the school will allow local newspapers to take photographs of children, when appropriate, provided that parental consent has been given. Some newspapers insist that children's names must be published with their photographs. If not, they may decline to cover school events. Therefore, we will normally give the children's full names (but not addresses) to newspapers. Parents are asked to sign a Privacy Notice relating to photographs of their child on admittance.

Langshott Admissions Policy

The school's published admission number is 60. The school has capacity for 420 children organised into 14 classes over seven year groups, Year R to Year 6.

Visits to the School

Prospective families are encouraged to visit the school and meet the Headteacher and staff. Tours are offered on alternate Friday mornings from September to January. You can call the school office to book on to a tour. To request a Reception place at Langshott Primary School, families need to complete the Surrey application form and **return it online directly to the Local Authority** as part of the admission arrangements.

Induction

Once your child has been offered a place, you will be invited to an information evening for new families where you will be able to meet the staff and find out about the Foundation Stage curriculum and what to expect when your child starts school. There will also be an opportunity for you to bring your child to Langshott to meet the staff, their new friends and to visit their new classroom, during the Summer Term.

Starting School

Children are admitted into school at the beginning of the Autumn Term in small groups over several days, so that each child may be given as much individual attention as possible to settle into school life.

School Meals

All pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are able to receive a school meal at no cost to the parent under the governments “Universal Free School Meals” scheme. From Year 3 upwards, free school meals are provided for any child whose parents are receiving Income Support, Jobseekers Allowance or certain Child Tax Credits. If you feel that you may qualify, please contact the School Office. All enquiries are treated in the strictest confidence.

School Uniform

Uniform is an important part of showing belonging to our school community. It should be worn correctly and with pride. Jumpers and cardigans should be worn unless it is warm. Coats or hoodies should not be worn instead of jumpers, unless during PE lessons. The school uniform colours are red and navy. Most items are available from www.onlineschooluniform.co.uk or can be purchased in large chain stores. Hoodies, Zoodies and Chair Bags are available direct from the school via the Scopay system or the office.

RECEPTION:

An important feature of the Reception curriculum is the emphasis on challenging, physical, active and sometimes messy play opportunities, both inside and outside. We aim to encourage independence. Our youngest children need clothing which is easy to cope with in the cloakroom, giving them the confidence to manage their own personal hygiene. Dresses and skirts can be worn, but please be mindful that they can be a hindrance to girls when they are climbing, balancing, riding a bike or digging in the sandpit. Jewellery is not permitted in Reception. If there is a religious or cultural need for jewellery, parents/carers should meet with the Early Years Lead or the Headteacher.

The uniform is:

- Navy blue jogging pants or navy blue trousers or shorts in summer (boys)
- Navy blue skirt / pinafore, jogging pants or trousers or red check dress in summer (girls)
- White polo shirt*
- Red jumper* or cardigan* (girls)
- Waterproof suit - navy blue waterproof trousers and jacket. These garments are essential to allow the children to make the most of our outside learning environment in wet weather.
- Wellington boots - any colour, clearly named.

KEY STAGE 1 & 2:

BOYS:

- Navy trousers - long in winter or short in summer
- White polo shirt*
- Red jumper*
- Warm, waterproof coat for playtimes. Hoodies are not permitted

GIRLS:

- Navy blue pinafore dress, skirt or trousers. Red checked dress in the summer. Navy blue cycling shorts may be worn under skirts/dresses if desired
- White polo shirt*
- Red jumper* or cardigan*
- Warm waterproof coat for playtimes. Hoodies are not permitted

SHOES – Boys and Girls

- Black or navy full front shoes (NOT trainers or boots) with easy fastening. Children should only wear lace ups if they are capable of tying them independently
- Plain navy, white or red socks
- Plain navy or red tights for girls in winter

PE UNIFORM

- PE drawstring bag*
- Navy blue PE shorts
- House PE T-shirt*
- Black plimsolls (elastic sided)
- Blue tracksuit bottoms in winter
- Trainers for outdoor use
- Navy blue Hoodie* or Zoodie* with Langshott Logo ONLY (in colder weather)

Hair styles should not be severe. Long hair should be tied back. Hair ties should be discreet – large bows/ribbons are not permitted. Jewellery is not permitted, except for a watch and one pair of small stud earrings (except Reception) that must be removed for PE. Children need to be able to remove their own earrings for PE lessons. Smart watches are not permitted as they have access to the internet. Hi-Viz Despatch bags*, safari caps* and jackets* are also available for both boys and girls. Backpacks* and Chair Bags are available for Years 3+ only.

** Available with Langshott Primary School name and logo by ordering online.*

Wearing of Jewellery during PE and Sports Activities

Whilst we would prefer that children do not wear any jewellery, we do permit watches and plain, stud earrings only for children in Years 1 to 6; these items have to be removed for PE lessons. Your child will be responsible for removal and replacement of their own jewellery or watches. The school cannot accept liability for any valuables brought into school by children. As pierced ears take six weeks to heal, we ask that any children having their ears pierced do so at the beginning of the summer holidays, otherwise children cannot participate in this important and compulsory part of the curriculum. Smart watches are not permitted.

We hope you feel able to comply with the above regulations and thank you for your co-operation.

Mobile Phones

We recognise that mobile phones are part of everyday life for many older children and that they can play an important role in helping pupils to feel safe and secure, especially if, as they get older, parents are allowing them to walk to and from school unaccompanied. However, we also recognise that they can prove a distraction in school and can provide a means of bullying or intimidating others. Therefore:

- Pupils are not permitted to have mobile phones at school or on school trips.
- If a parent wishes his/her child to bring a mobile phone to school, the parent must attend a Technology Meeting held at the school in order to get permission for this.
- Once permission has been obtained, the phone must be switched off and handed to the teacher first thing in the morning and collected by the child at home time (the phone is left at the owner's own risk).
- Mobile phones brought to school without permission will be confiscated and returned to a parent only at the end of the day.

Where mobile phones are used in or out of school to bully or intimidate others, then the Headteacher does have the power to intervene to such an extent as it is reasonable to regulate the behaviour of pupils when they are off the school site.

We ask that parents do not use mobile phones on the school premises at any time, so that we can safeguard our children.

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality are vitally important if your child is to make the most of the educational opportunities we offer. If he/she is unwell and cannot come to school, please telephone the school before 8.30am and leave a message. **If your child has been sick, they must remain away from school for 48 hours after the last bout of sickness to ensure that any bugs are not spread.**

Parents are reminded not to book family holidays, long weekends away or treat days during term time, as we will not authorise absence for these under any circumstance. We will only ever authorise absence for religious observance, a funeral or an educational activity, e.g. participating in a sporting event, performance, taking music or dance exams, or similar.

Langshott Out of School Childcare – Crystal Club

Langshott Primary School has a fully extended school day. We offer an extended programme of enrichment from 7.30am until 6.00pm from Monday to Friday during term time. We provide high quality provision offering a warm, comfortable and welcoming environment. There are opportunities for the children to enjoy a range of activities, including outside activities. The club is situated in our Crystal room and the children also have access to the school playground and play equipment. The children are given a snack at the after school care club and are provided with breakfast at the breakfast care club.

If you wish to take advantage of the provision, you will need to register your child. Once registered, you will be able to use the club at any time, providing places are available and that you have booked (and paid) in advance. Please see the school office for a registration form.
