Relationships, Sex and Health Education Week (RSHE)

Dear Parent/Carer,

This term, class teachers will be teaching lessons that are part of an on-going programme of RSHE that begins in Reception and continues to Year 6.

Year 2 classes will be taught RSHE during the week commencing **8th June 2026**. The scheme of work covers:

- Life cycles in nature
- Growing from young to old
- Increasing independence
- Differences in female and male bodies (correct terminology)
- Assertiveness
- Preparing for moving to a new year group and to Key Stage Two

To avoid confusion, it is important that the proper terminology for the parts of the body are used from Reception upwards. It is fine for children to call the parts of the body by the 'home' names when not in school, but to prevent misunderstanding and confusion during lessons and school, proper names will be used, for example: penis; vagina and nipple, etc.

Vocabulary we use in Year 2 – affection, acceptable, adult, anus, anxious, appearance, baby, change, child, comfortable, control, cuddle, dislike, excited, female, freedom, fully grown, grow, growing up, happy, hug, independent, life cycle, like, male, nervous, old, penis, physical, private, public, respect, responsibilities, squeeze, teenager, testicles, texture, toddler, touch, vagina, unacceptable, uncomfortable, young.
