I started as an NQT at Langshott last year and I have loved joining an environment that is child-focussed with high standards for all staff and for all children. We were given opportunities for training in different areas as well as having personalised support as part of our NQT journey. As an NQT+1 we have been given additional responsibilities as a subject leader working in faculty groups, which has been a fantastic experience. This year our voices and ideas continue to be supported and valued with opportunities to share and discuss ideas through the NQT+1 support package and we have been invited to take our ideas and be creative in our teaching, providing further inspirational opportunities for our children.

Becky says...

I am very pleased I decided to do my NQT year at Langshott School. I started on a one year temporary contract and have been lucky enough to stay ever since! In September I will be starting my third year here. I felt supported from day one, as an NQT you are assigned a mentor to support you. You meet regularly with them and the advice, ideas and support I received have been invaluable. My induction programme was structured to ensure I received the right development, support and monitoring tools in order to gain the experience to become an excellent teacher. The feedback I have received was always a positive and constructive experience. I felt so lucky throughout my NQT year and even to this day, I have some of the best teachers that I look up to giving me ideas on how to improve my teaching further. It is not just your NQT mentor you can seek support from, we are like a family here and everyone is always happy to lend a listening ear or give support when needed.

My teaching journey has always been with Langshott. I trained through the SCITT program and whilst on a 6-week placement here, fell in love with the school. I was extremely keen to carry out my NQT year with such a strong team of staff and lovely students. Throughout my first year, I was guided by an experienced mentor, who directed me to succeed with support and freedom. I was encouraged to try things and learn from a broad style of teachers. By the time I got to my third year of teaching, I was given the opportunity to develop my leadership skills and by the fourth year became part of the Langshott Leadership team, where I have been able to share my passion for wellbeing and mental health. I absolutely love working here and wouldn't want to be anywhere else, I look forward to the journeys that Langshott will bring in the future.







Curriculum Intent

At Langshott, our vision is to create a school which encourages its children to be successful learners (LEARNING); confident individuals (PRIDE); and to achieve personal empowerment (SUCCESS).

The building blocks of learning, which make up LANGSHOTT are the foundations on which our curriculum is built. Our aim is that these elements run through every lesson, experience and opportunity:
