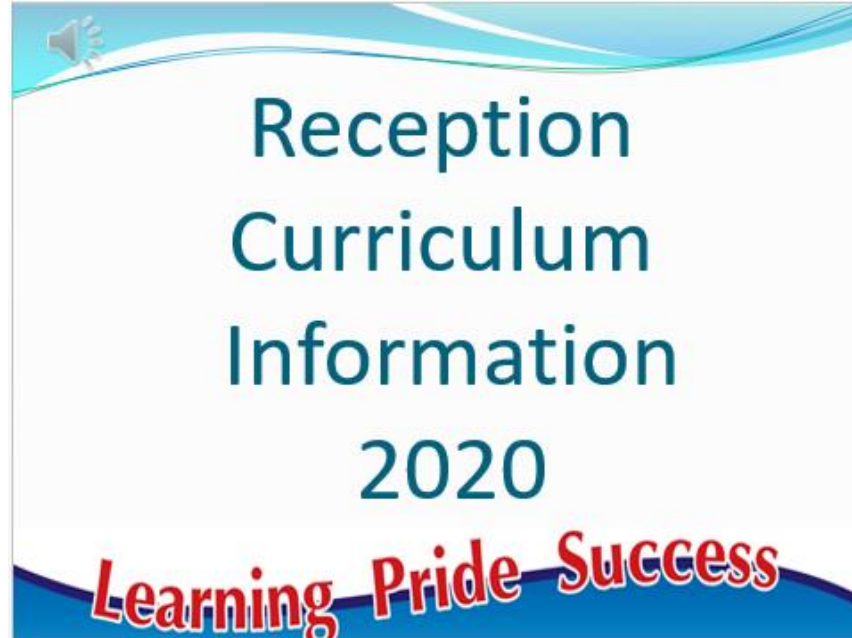

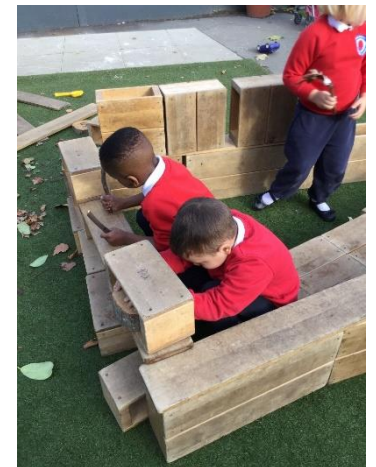
Here are some of our current Reception pupils in Sapphire classroom taking part in an indoor physical brain gym activity.

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Across the school, we have an impressive environment to work in. These photos show some of our lovely classrooms from all year groups.





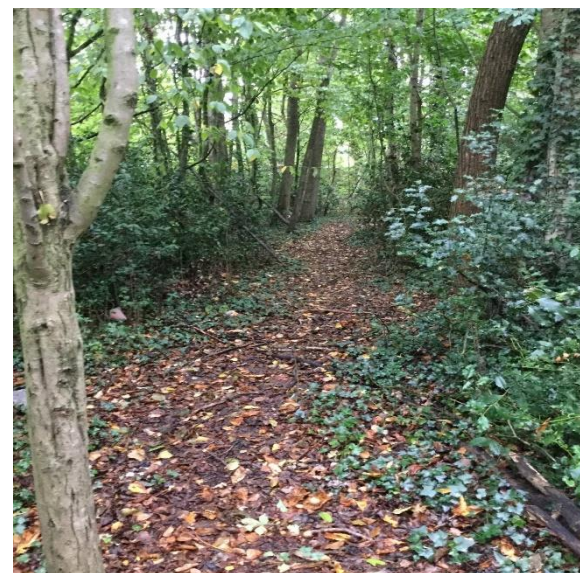
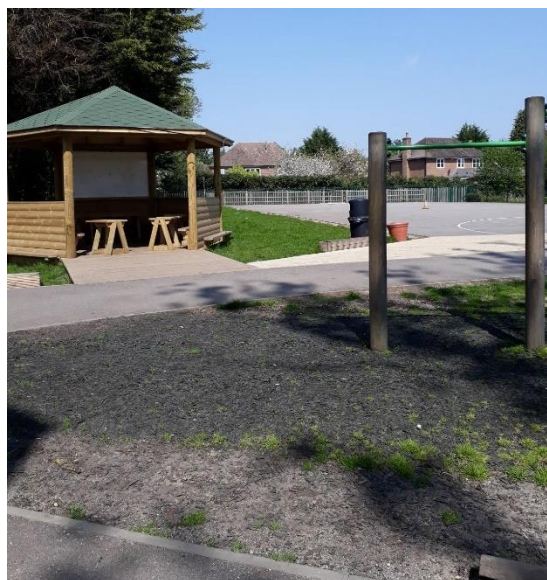

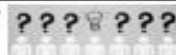

Homework (we call this Home Learning)

Every child is expected to do weekly home learning and daily reading.

Home Learning in Reception

Your child will be learning up to four new letter sounds or 'tricky words' each week at School.

We ask that you practise the sounds at home with your child, learning the actions which accompany each one. Your child may like to 'be the teacher' and teach you what they have been learning! Please encourage your child to think of words which begin with the sounds learnt and even have a go at writing some words or sentences when they are more confident.

We also like your child to practise writing each letter, following the cursive script examples. We will collect the Home Learning Folder in on a Tuesday, sending them back home again with your child on the Friday. If we have not learnt any new sounds in a week, we will still send the folders home for your child to practise and consolidate their learning.

We reward our pupils for good work and behaviour by giving STARS Points and through an app called Marvellous Me.
