

We have lovely outdoor facilities, just for the Reception pupils. A garden, a Wendy house, a woodland area, sand pit, mud kitchen and climbing facilities.







## We use restorative approaches to behaviour. Below is an example of our behaviour reflection sheet.








We have high expectations of handwriting and presentation and we celebrate this with 'Presentation Prince or Princess' crowns that the children will be awarded and wear in class for the day.

## This is an example of what we expect of handwriting that will earn a Pen Licence:

During the long cramped, scorching journey, I thought about where I was going, who was I going to meet and why you could not come with me because I really miss you (a lot). Besides that, my teacher same with me but she was too busy shouting and whipping noughty children except from me (of course). ### Homework (we call this Home Learning) Every child is expected to do weekly home learning and daily reading.

### **Home Learning in Reception**

Your child will be learning up to four new letter sounds or 'tricky words' each week at School.

We ask that you practise the sounds at home with your child, learning the actions which accompany each one. Your child may like to 'be the teacher' and teach you what they have been learning! Please encourage your child to think of words which begin with the sounds learnt and even have a go at writing some words or sentences when they are more confident.

We also like your child to practise writing each letter, following the cursive script examples. We will collect the Home Learning Folder in on a Tuesday, sending them back home again with your child on the Friday. If we have not learnt any new sounds in a week, we will still send the folders home for your child to practise and consolidate their learning.





# We reward our pupils for good work and behaviour by giving STARS Points and through an app called Marvellous Me.
