

# Beginning to Use the Vocabulary Involved in Adding

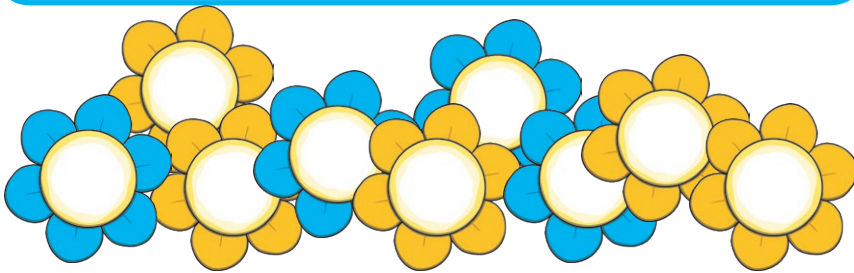
## Home Learning Challenges

Do you have a board game where you need to roll a dice? Can you count on from the number you are on? Try putting the number in your head and then counting on the number shown on the dice.

Think of a number up to 10. Make a tower with that number of bricks. Ask your friend or a grown-up to do the same. How many bricks do you have each? Join the towers together. How many bricks do you have altogether?

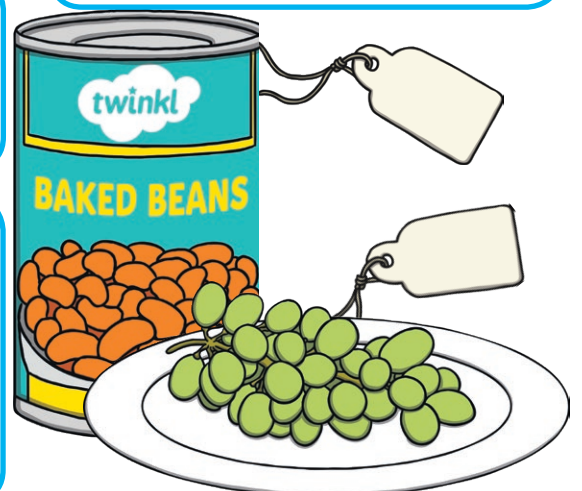


Ask a grown-up to put a small number of raisins and a small number of cereal pieces in a bowl. Can you line up the raisins and the cereal? How many do you have of each? How many do you have altogether?



Gather some soft toys in a pile. Make one toy line up by the door. Now add one more to the line. Keep adding one more. What is happening to the line?

Draw a picture of a garden. Draw 5 yellow flowers and 4 blue flowers. How many flowers did you draw altogether?



Take some food packets and tins and give each one a price tag of up to 10p or 20p. The shopkeeper needs to put all the prices up by 3p. Can you say how much the food costs now?
