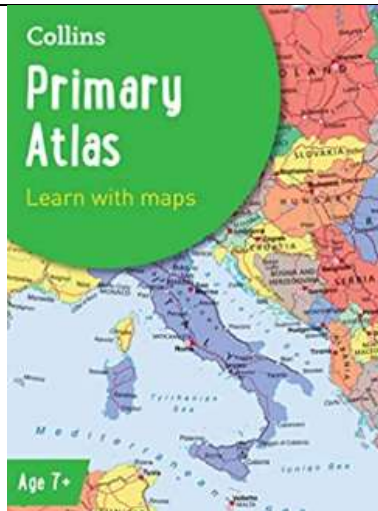




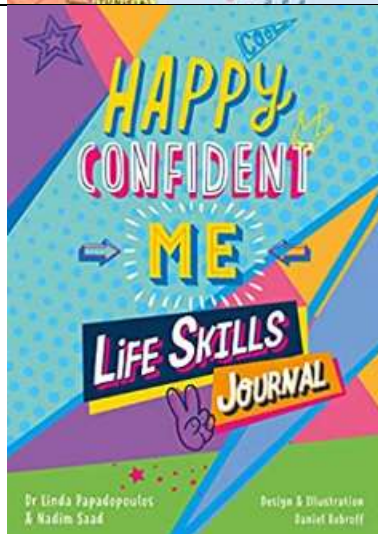
Year 6 – Recommended Reading List

We are still using Goodnight Mr Tom for some writing inspiration, but we will be covering lots of other topics too!

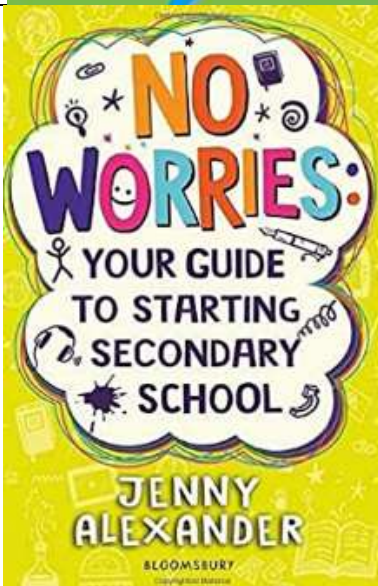

	<p>This story takes its readers first to Buenos Aires followed by Bariloche. Children learn the names of some of the existing plants, animals, fish, national landmarks and food items typical for Argentina. While following Nick and his sister Aya, the readers virtually visit a cave, a glacier, a bird sanctuary, lakes, streams, and mountains. They end their vacation at the Iguazu Falls and return home full of new impressions.</p>
	<p>The easy-to-read book takes readers on an exciting adventure to the 12 counties that make up the South American continent.</p>
	<p>This book allows readers the opportunity to explore key countries, topographical features and cities in a way that is both engaging and entertaining. In addition, each book highlights significant human, geographical, sporting and economic information.</p>
