Our Geography Vision

At Langshott Primary School we believe that Geography helps to provoke and provide answers to questions about the natural and human aspects of the world. Children are encouraged to develop a greater understanding and knowledge of the world, as well as their place in it. The geography curriculum at Langshott Primary School enables children to develop knowledge and skills that are transferable to other curriculum areas and which can and are used to promote their spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. Geography is, by nature, an investigative subject, which develops an understanding of concepts, knowledge and skills.

Our Aims

Our aim is to ensure all children develop their knowledge of Human and Physical geography in addition to significant locations that relate to our curriculum at Langshott and our community. The geographical skills necessary to achieve our aims include, locational knowledge, place knowledge, human and physical geography, map skills and field work.

Knowledge-

Human and Physical Features	
	In KS1 the Children will be taught to describe and understand key aspects of geography including seasonal and weather patterns. In KS2 the children will learn about climate zones, rivers, mountains, volcanoes, earthquakes, the water cycle, types of settlement, economic activity and the distribution of natural resources.
Locational Knowledge	
	The children will name and locate cities, countries, continents and oceans describing their characteristics.
Place Knowledge	
	The children will understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography at a local level and of another place in either the UK, Europe, or a region in North or South America.

Skills-

Map Skills	
	The children at Langshott will have the opportunity to analyse world maps, atlases, globes, aerial photographs and learn basic map skills, understand compass directions, a key, a title, grid references and ordinance surveys.
Field Work	
	The children will use fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school grounds and local area. They will discuss, record and present the human and physical features using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.
