



## RE-Why do Christians share communion? (Year 5)

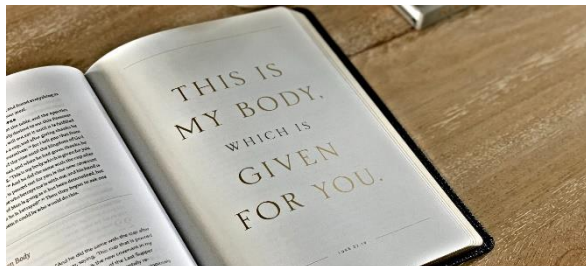
**Outcome:** To write a prayer that could be said at the end of communion service, reflecting on what is important to Christians.
