

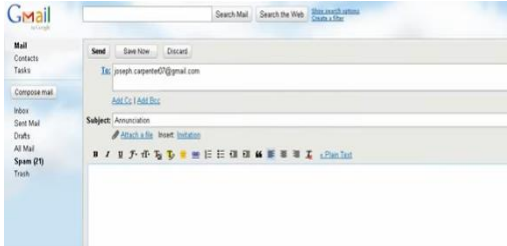


RE- What do the Gospels say about the good news of Jesus? (Year 5)
