Prior Knowledge

Online relationships

- Give examples of when I should ask permission to do something online and explain why this is important.
- Use the internet with adult support to communicate with people I know.
- Explain why it is important to be considerate and kind to people online and to respect their choices.
- Explain why things one person finds funny or sad online may not always be seen in the same way by others.

Online Reputation

- Recognise that information can stay online and could be copied.
- Describe what information I should not put online without asking a trusted adult first

Online Bullying

- Describe how to behave online in ways that do not upset others and can give examples

Managing online information

- Give simple examples of how to find information using digital technologies.
- Understand that we can encounter a range of things online including things we like and don't like as well as things which are real or make believe / a joke.
- Know how to get help from a trusted adult if we see content that makes us feel sad, uncomfortable worried or frightened.

- Give examples of how someone might use technology to communicate with others they don't know offline and explain why this might be risky.
- Explain who you should ask before sharing things about myself or others online.
- Describe different ways to ask for, give, or deny permission online and can identify who can help me if not sure.
- Explain why I have a right to say 'no' or 'I will have to ask someone'.
- Identify who can help if something happens online without my consent.
- Explain why you should always ask a trusted adult before clicking 'yes', 'agree' or 'accept' online.

Online reputation



- Explain how information put online about someone can last for a long time.
- Describe how anyone's online information could be seen by others.
- Who to talk to if something has been put online without consent or if it is incorrect.

Online bullying



- Explain what bullying is, how people may bully others and how bullying can make someone feel.
- Explain why anyone who experiences bullying is not to blame.
- Talk about how anyone experiencing bullying can get help.

Managing online information



- Use simple keywords in search engines.
- Demonstrate how to navigate a simple webpage to get to information.
- Explain what voice activated searching is and how it might be used, and know it is not a real person.
- Explain the difference between things that are imaginary, 'made up' or 'make believe' and things that are 'true' or 'real'.
- Explain why some information found online may not be real or true.
